Introduction:

The NG-CARES Programme is an emergency operation designed to support budgeted Programme of expenditures and interventions at the State level – targeting existing and newly emerging vulnerable and poor households, agricultural value chains, and Micro and Small Enterprises (MSEs) affected by the economic crisis.

NG-CARES Programme is designed to restore the livelihoods of the poor and vulnerable, maintaining food security, and facilitating recovery of MSEs are some of the key objectives set out in the Government's Economic Sustainability Plan (ESP) to respond to the current economic crisis in Nigeria.

Program Development Objective:

“To expand access to livelihood support and food security services, and grants for poor and vulnerable households and firms”.

The PDOs will be measured using three results indicators:

- (a) Number of beneficiaries of targeted safety nets and with access to basic social services (disaggregated by gender),
- (b) Number of farmers supported to increase food production (disaggregated by gender),
- (c) Number of vulnerable and viable firms supported by the Programme (disaggregated by gender).

Result Area 1

The Result Area main objective is : *Increased social transfers, basic services, and livelihood support to poor and vulnerable households*

The interventions supported by Results Area 1 in Adamawa State include;

The Result Area is implementing Two (2) out of the Nine Disbursement Linked Indicators of the state. Thus

DLI 1.2: *Labour intensive Public Workfare*- The objective of LIPW is to provide immediate employment opportunity in social services and work, thereby addressing the emergency constraints of loss of labour income among poor and vulnerable households as a result of COVID-19 pandemics.

DLI 1.4 : *Community and Vulnerable Groups Basic Service Delivery* – The objective of this component is to provide basic services in the sectors of health, education, nutrition, water and sanitation at the community level.

Disbursement Linked Indicators

A: DLI 1.2 – Labour intensive Public Workfare (LIPW)

- **LIPW (DLI 1.2):** Mined **4,353**, comprising of **2,201** females and **2,152** male. Enrolled and Deployed **4,050**, comprising of **2,039** females and **2,011** males. Sensitized Stakeholders in all the targeted communities within the 21 LGAs that are participating in the **LIPW**.

LIPW engages the Payment Service Provider (PSP) and beneficiaries are paid monthly stipend of **N10,000** starting from July 2022 to date and in contingent on minimum of 4 work hours per day for 20 days in a month and attestation by their supervisors drawn from amongst them, based on daily attendance records.

The enrolled and deployed beneficiaries undertake monthly capacity building/skills acquisition and entrepreneurial training to get feedback from beneficiaries and reinforce expectations and deliverables. Beneficiaries were assigned to specific duties within their communities based on community driven interventions and interventions arising from community request.

Some public work activities, to which beneficiaries were deployed depending on needs in the community, are:

- Construction and rehabilitation of community feeder roads;
- Rehabilitation of water canals for irrigation schemes;
- Reforestation;
- Gully reclamation;
- Construction of livestock selling pens;
- Rehabilitation of small bridges;
- Brick molding for construction purposes;
- Rehabilitation of classroom blocks and toilets;
- Improvement and beautification of public spaces including the cleaning of public areas, planting of trees and flowers;
- Garbage and refuse collection and waste disposal;
- Traffic control;
- Civil security unit;
- Repairing of clinics/primary health centres;
- Disaster prevention activities appropriate to the community;
- Water resource management and water harvesting, mainly spring water sources development and extension;
- Any other public work activities peculiar to each community.

B: DLI 1.4 – Community and Vulnerable Groups Basic Service.

- **Community and VG Basic Service (DLI 1.4):** 6 CDPs and 6 GDPs have been approved, and 23 MPs fully completed and functional. Trained Eight (8) LGRCs as well as carried out field and desk appraisals of 11 GrDPs and 11 CDPs. A total of 28,399 Individuals are benefitting directly from the completed micro projects across Adamawa State.
